Using the most current voter registration list and running it against Census data, we are able to target blocks in neighborhoods across the state where voter registration drives would be most effective. The data can be sorted for race, income, employment, age and other demographics. Pick a county, and you can find a precinct and print maps that show high areas of unregistered and infrequent voters.
